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Does instinctive behaviour exist?

- Proponents — Ardrey, Lorenz, Tiger, Morris
- Based on data from animal kingdom; baboons →  
(dogs, lions, ~~etc.~~) ←
  - Why baboons? Great apes: gorillas, gibbons, chimp & orangutans (Morris admits <sup>pacific</sup> complex structure to get men out of trees & predators based on idea that they are)
  - Weakness of data — (most successful society)
  - Hunting species but live primarily by gathering — and when they abandon hunting → increase in population

- Whole argument is not only specious but irrelevant when applied to human culture
  - mutability of human culture even when environment is a constant: courtship, eating, <sup>id. ritu-fac. Rose caravans like head hunting Art</sup>
  - Margaret Mead: Arapesh, Mundugamoor, Tchambuli: exist in small area.
  - Man is a culture-bearing animal — culture expresses our biological success & is also a result of it — use symbolism, abstraction, ingenuity to invent new ways of dealing with the world. → a process in which man makes himself, unlike all other animals: e.g. the Pill

• Causality: the key Q

For the mighty → 'the argument of least variability' → Aristotle on Slavery; freedom is unnatural  
Truth may be that women, slaves etc. are inferior — Question is then why Not to beq it, say natural → in this society, socialization Reinforces structural inferiority → economic, pol. it., social, psych.

What determinants?

- 1) Biology one influence
- 2) Ecology of the society more impt. technology, knowledge, natural resources. / birth control
- 3) History from man the hunter to tender of animals. women as gatherers → simple agriculture
- 4) Relations to external societies → man roves, makes contacts, has weapons. → defense, warfare
- 5) Government & laws by elite groups → men.

In primate world males stronger — warfare/protection  
is female: mother

\* \* \* But no economic div of labour — e.g. forages for self  
no home, no sexual exploitation of the female, rel.  
little stable pairing (except gibbons)

- Came out of trees (climactic changes) which also entailed eating <sup>less food available</sup> more meat — true div of labour → man the hunter (co-operatively)

Mead quote - Can function reciprocally between hunters & gatherers,  
esp. when no surplus. — the more impt. placed on gathering, the closer to equal.

Horticultural tribes off matrilineal, matrilocal  
Hunting/herding large a's: patrilineal, lower status for women.
